

Credit Union Funded Mural Unveiled

A 26-foot lobby mural, funded in its entirety by Clearview[®] Federal Credit Union, was recently unveiled at Life'sWork of Western Pa., a non-profit organization committed to assisting persons with disabilities or other barriers to achieving employment and independence. The mural, titled "Pittsburgh Bridges," was designed by Daniel Cartner, a student of Pittsburgh Technical Institute (PTI).

"The leadership and volunteers of Life'sWork are to be commended for the opportunities they have provided Southwestern Pennsylvanians with disabilities for over 80 years," said Clearview President/CEO Mark S. Brennan.

Students of PTI originally submitted a total of 10 designs to Life'sWork, and the staff, tenants, clients, family members, and board members were asked to cast a vote for their favorite design. The mural was unveiled to the public during a recent reception. President/CEO Mark S. Brennan, as well as numerous Clearview employees, were on hand for the public unveiling, and enjoyed a tour of the facility.
